STAMP OF THE MONTH

JAPAN — IN 1953 - 1954, Japan issued a 10-yen Goddess Kannon stamp (Scot 580) with a redrawn design based on a similar stamp issued in 1951.

The stamps were issued in two different varieties of booklets of 10 stamps and two attached labels.

One type of booklet was issued in honor of Philatelic Week in 1954. The other booklet was not issued to commemorate anything. Panes from the Philatelic Week booklet (Scott 580a) can be distinguished from panes from the other booklet (580b) by the inscriptions on the labels.

The inscriptions on the labels on Scott 580a are arranged in two columns of boldface characters. On 580b, the left-handed label inscriptions are arranged in three columns of mixed heavy and thin characters.

The Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue, values panes from both booklets, but does not value the intact booklets.

The Scott standard catalog values the mint pane from the second booklet (Scott 580b) at \$67.50. This is a good price for the intact booklet, and if you see it offered at this price you should buy it. Make sure that you buy the intact booklet and not just the pane, as all the demand is for the booklet.

OKINAWA FALLS TO YANKS

June 21, 1945 ~ Just 350 miles southwest of the Japanese home islands, Okinawa is the last crucial stop of the American island-hopping campaign. After months of bombardment, the largest American amphibious invasion in the Pacific war lands more than 60,000 troops on the island on Easter Sunday (April 1) 1945. Dug-in on the Southern end of the island and supported by waves of kamikaze attacks from the air, more than 77,000 battle-hardened troops of the Japanese 32nd Army wait for the Americans advance. In desperate hand-to-hand fighting that drags on for nearly three months, an estimated 12,000 Americans and more than 100,000 Japanese lose their lives.

MINUTE MAN STATUE (5 CENT)

THE five cent stamp shows the Minute Man statue that stands in Minute Man National Historical Park in Massachusets. This statue was created by Daniel



Chester French in 1875 and stands where the colonial militia and minutemen fought at the North Bridge on the first day of the Revolutionary War. The 970 acre park includes a

number of other important historical locations including the Obelisk Monument, the first monument to American War casualties, the Hartwell Tavern, and the Wayside, a colonial house that was home to Louisa May Alcott, Nathaniel Hawthorne and others.
