STAMP OF THE MONTH

NITED STATES — On March 26, 1952 the U.S. issued an attractive 80¢ airmail stamp showing Diamond Head in Honolulu (Scott C46). The design shows the extinct volcano framed by palm trees with a multi-engine airplane flying low over the water.

Collecting full mint panes of modern U.S. stamps is growing in popularity. The full pane of 50, 80¢ Diamond Head airmail stamp is in strong demand.

The Scott *Specialized Catalogue of United States Stamps and Covers* values a mint single at \$5, so the catalog value for the 50 stamps in a pane is \$250. Panes are currently selling for up to \$300.


Grade and condition are just as important when buying full panes as when buying a single stamp. Make sure that all of the stamps in the pane have full undisturbed gum and all stamps are at least very fine.

'WHAT HATH GOD WROUGHT?'

ROM the Supreme Court's chamber in Washington



D.C., Samuel F.B. Morse sends the biblical message, "What hath God wrought?" over an experimental telegraph line. Albert Vail, Morse's assistant stationed at Baltimore's Mt. Clare Depot. receives the historic message and deciphers toe code of dots and dashes. By 1861 Western Union had completed its transcontinental telegraph line and the instant-communication technology that is Morse

Code becomes crucial in the American Civil War.
